### 1. Presentation

- Eleethea Savage from the City of Greater Sudbury presented the Junction Project.

### 2. Update on 2018 CAN Activities

- Rachelle presented updates on the projects that we are currently working on and asked people in attendance to provide additional ideas or proposals on our ideas board.
- The Twin Forks Park community garden is currently being prepared. We are involving primary school children again as well as the Best Start Hub. School plantings are in progress. The Westmount 4-H Club is expanding their garden at Westmount Park.
- We are seeking donations for a splash pad at Twin Forks. Anyone who is interested in helping with this project can contact Mike Morelli.
- We are also seeking help with a smaller version of New Sudbury Days. Anyone interested can contact Rachelle Niemela.
- Our art project at Twin Forks is in progress and children at Holy Trinity participated in a painting session today, led by Johanna Westby, local artist.
- We have been accepted to be part of Project Impact funded project. One of our rain barrels will be painted by a group of students.
- A community yard sale will likely be held in July at Twin Forks.
- We may hold a visioning session in the fall.
- We will hold a candidate's town hall, likely in September.
- The Junction Creek festival was a success – approx.. 460 people attended this year.

### 3. Update from the Greater Sudbury Police Service

- There have been some local break-ins, one at a residence on Lasalle, and in sheds.
- Some bikes have also been stolen.
- Some of these have been in the Embassy/Valleystream areas.

- GSPS are conducting a knock program in the affected areas and will be doing additional patrols.
- Everyone is asked to report any suspicious behaviour.
- Officers on bikes patrols will now be patrolling in New Sudbury.
